"You know, I was supposed to take them home last Thursday but when I got to the dentist's office the dentist had had a family emergency and wasn't available so, instead, God gave me the opportunity to pray for the dentist and his family."

Way to stay on task brother!

I would like to introduce you to our newest resident staff member Leah. Leah would tell you that she was scared at first when she came to the Mission two months ago. Having lived and worked in a professional environment most of her life anything with the words homeless or shelter were scary. She came to Coos Bay two years ago from SW Ohio where she ran an Equestrian center.

Leah made the mistake of following a man to the Oregon Coast. When the relationship didn't work out heart break set in and with it came the alcohol. Never having a problem with drugs or alcohol before it only took one short year of drinking to land her in a nine-day hospital stay.

Leah has been sober for over a year now. She admits that while she has known who Jesus was most of her life she was not a follower. That was the missing piece she says, a lack of devotion. That ambivalence towards Jesus is gone and she was super eager to join the discipleship program here at the Mission. To steer a course in her life towards the real heart healer, Jesus Christ.
