A place to help me become a better member to my community and a better son to Jesus. I am very grateful to be at the Mission, what a blessing God has given me. As for me and my house we shall serve the Lord."

Shawn (not pictured) said, "doesn't matter what your circumstances are you are welcomed with open arms and taken care of so you can overcome those things that brought you here."

Steve (not pictured) said, "the Mission is a haven from a habit of selfinflicted hazards and offers me a place to be of service to God while also finding healing for myself."

Art is a veteran and a former pastor. He does not have a drug or alcohol problem but medical issues forced him to seek shelter at the Mission. He says "the Mission means a Christian environment with daily devotion and nightly chapel."

Karen (not pictured) was sleeping in her van before coming to the Mission. When asked what the Mission means to her she said, "Safety, as a single woman I was always afraid and could never really get any sleep."

While sitting in the office of her probation officer Jennifer looked down and saw a business card for the Mission. She has been here for four months now and has one year sober. She said, "the Mission means accountability for our actions and a place to be obedient to the Lord. A place to come together and have fellowship and pray and see growth in each other. A place of safety and shelter where we can all gather together believing in Jesus." June
