Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

Myself and Rob Hill, the pastor from Allegany Community Church, had been working on sharing a message at the Mission that involved foot washing. The original plan was for my wife and myself to wash each other's feet. Once done we would go out and wash all the residents' feet. While this was going on Rob would be sharing the message.

At the end of a discipleship class, a couple of weeks before the message, I asked Rob a question about the format when the resident staff started asking their own questions. They were so interested that I asked if any of them wanted to help and I was pleasantly surprised at all the hands that shot up that wanted to wash feet themselves!

So, we changed it. After my wife and I washed each other's feet we washed the resident staff feet. Then the staff went out and washed the rest of the residents' feet. Boys washing boys' feet and girls washing girls' feet. There were a lot of tears that night and it was truly one of the most Holy Spirit moving nights we have had here at the Mission.

Suicide is a very real danger with those that we serve here at the Mission. I can think of several suicides in the recent past with an organization that works in the same environment as the Mission. So this month we had a class V.A. S.A.V.E suicide prevention training for caregivers. I would like to say thank you to Ariana Ryzebol, LCSW the Suicide Prevention Coordinator that taught the class and the resident staff who were willing to attend. It can be a difficult topic.
